

Y4 Home learning – Monday 18th May to Friday 5th June

Hello again! We hope you are well and surviving lockdown. At school we think you're doing SO well and it's lovely to see so many of you getting involved in the Y4 blog and sending us photos of what you are getting up to and the work you have done.

This is the third Home Learning pack we are sending out. As last time, the next three weeks will involve activities for you to do online, off line or a mixture of the two – depending on how you prefer to work. You can of course send us any question about the home learning via the homework@stml.bolton.sch.uk email address.

Half term: We are including enough work in the pack to last for three weeks, but as our half term break is from Monday 25th May to Friday 5th June, we won't be setting any extra online tasks for that first week only. There will be enough work set to ensure children can continue home learning over that week if you wish, and online tasks will start up again on week beginning Monday 1st June for those who want to continue learning online. Obviously things may change if government guidelines change, but be assured as soon as we know anything, we'll let you know.

ENGLISH:

- Try to spend 10-15 minutes each day reading for pleasure.
- Practise your handwriting - Have a go at writing a short amount each day. It would be great if you could record your experiences while staying at home. In your exercise book you could write a short diary talking about your feelings and what you are doing each day.
- Practise a set of 10 spellings from the list I gave you of the Y4 100 words.
- I have included a reading comprehension which you can answer on the sheet or in your exercise books. Remember to use the skills we learnt in class.
- I have also included a SPAG paper to see what spelling, punctuation and grammar you remember.

MATHS:

- Practise your times tables on TTracks – try to improve your speed.
- I have included an arithmetic paper for you and a times tables mosaics worksheet for you to complete.
- You could practise telling the time. How many clocks can you see in your home? Can you convert them from analogue to digital? You could record your findings in your exercise book.
- You could also see if you remember the different types of triangles. (remember the rap?) How many of these different triangles can you find at home?
- You could also have a go at estimating then finding the perimeter of some shapes in your house. Take a ruler or a tape measure and measure the outside of the shape.

ONLINE

- There will be 3 LbQ tasks to complete on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
