

Y6 Home learning – Monday 18th May to Friday 5th June

Hello again! We hope you are well and surviving lockdown. At school we think you're doing SO well and it's lovely to see so many of you getting involved in the Y6 blog and sending us photos of what you are getting up to and the work you have done.

This is the third Home Learning pack we are sending out. As last time, the next three weeks will involve activities for you to do online, off line or a mixture of the two – depending on how you prefer to work. Half term: We are including enough work in the pack to last for three weeks, but as our half term break is from Monday 25th May to Friday 5th June, we won't be setting any extra online tasks for that first week only. There will be enough work set to ensure children can continue home learning over that week if you wish, and online tasks will start up again on week beginning Monday 1st June for those who want to continue learning online. Obviously things may change if government guidelines change, but be assured as soon as we know anything, we'll let you know.

ENGLISH:

- Try to spend 10-15 minutes each day reading for pleasure.
- Practise your handwriting - Have a go at writing a short amount each day. You could write newspaper articles, letters to friends and family, songs, poetry or stories.
- Practise a set of 10 spellings from the list I gave you.

MATHS:

- Practise your times tables. Make 2 sets of cards and write 1-12 on both sets. Each player shuffles the cards and puts them face down in front of them. Both players turn a card over at the same time and puts them in the centre so the number is face up. The first person to say the answer to the times table wins both cards. Or you can use TTRockstars.
- Practise telling the time converting from the 12-hour clock to 24-hour clock.

ONLINE

- There will be three Mathletics tasks to cover over a week.
- There will be four Purple Mash activities to complete over a week. Have a look at your 2dos.
- There will be 3 LbQ tasks to complete on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- On Tuesday and Thursday, please complete one of these online tasks. (Don't worry about the date on them)
